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Javits Is Critical but Undaunted After Agnew Attack on Liberals

HERKIMER, N. Y., Oct. 21—Senator Jacob K. Javits said today that he still supported the Nixon-Agnew ticket despite Spiro T. Agnew's attack on the Liberal party.

The Republican Senator, who is running for reelection with Liberal party support, made his comment after being told that Mr. Agnew, speaking in Texas, had described New York's Liberal party as "far out" and not "representative of Americanism as Texans understand it."

"I still endorse the Nixon ticket, [pause] which includes Mr. Agnew," Senator Javits quipped at Rome, N. Y.

The Senator said such "gyrations" as the remarks of the Republican Vice Presidential candidate had no effect on his campaign. He said he was, running on the same record on both Liberal and Republican tickets.

"People of this state know I'll be my own man," he said. Mr. Javits, in a statement, went on to defend the Liberal party as a "responsible American political instrumentality" that was started two decades ago "to fight Communism in the trade union movement."

Reminded that he had defended Mr. Agnew only yesterday as a man "who is learning" and

who will be equal to the Vice Presidency, Mr. Javits quipped again: "We'll, I'd say he's not learning all at once."

The Senator's refusal to make a sharp attack on Mr. Agnew was in keeping with his careful and even tempered, if rather lengthy stating of his views in the campaign's closing weeks.

On today's flying visit he went to the Rochester suburbs, Rome and finally to a Republican dinner here attended by nearly 500 people. The Senator, still too busy to get a long-planned haircut, zipped to appointments behind a police motorcycle escort.

Campaigning in fertile Republican country, the Senator called for a wide range of Federal budget cuts and a shift of Federal financial priorities to give more aid to the nation's cities.

Obviously countering efforts by opponents to label him a "big spender" he told a Republican woman's club luncheon in Pittsford, a fashionable Rochester suburb:

"Sure I'm a liberal, but a liberal who looks behind the label. When it comes to money, I'm as hard-headed as anybody. I don't want to waste a nickel or see a dime go down the drain in fraud."
